

# 2ND INTERNATIONAL SECURITY INTELLIGENCE COURSE 2009



## FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

The 2<sup>nd</sup> International Security Intelligence Course 2009 is without a doubt going to be one of the most informative courses we have ever delivered.

The planning and logistics going into this course are some of the most complex we have yet undertaken.

Only a few positions are left but we thought we would answer a few questions to assist those already enrolled or who are thinking of enrolling.

- Q. Is this course 9.00am – 5.00pm and set in a classroom environment.
- A. No, definitely not. The first day only will be held in a fixed location where basic instruction will be provided in interviewing, problem solving, planning and logistics.

The rest of the course is totally practical with delegates travelling to various locations as part of the course. The hours will be variable and we have the attitude that you start when you need to in order to accomplish your tasks and you finish when you finish.

- Q. Will I be required to spend any nights away from home?
- A. Yes, on at least two occasions you will be away from home. We cannot tell you where you will stay but it will be in a location within 200kms of the CBD. The reason for this is that the course is true to life and on some days you will work late and need to start early in a particular location.
- Q. Do I have to be a security officer or investigator to attend this course or get a benefit from the training.
- A. No, in fact many of our delegates are not security personnel or investigators. This course is not about security it is about people skills and managing situations that can sometimes be quite challenging. In this course you will learn how to work with people from other backgrounds whilst achieving objectives that need much thought. The only attributes you must have is common sense and the desire to learn.

- Q. Will the course be stressful and physically demanding?
- N. Yes and No, there will be situations where stress levels will rise and the adrenalin will be pumping but we will not place you in any situation where deliberate harm could come to you.

You do not need to be an athlete to participate, however, you will need a basic degree of fitness and the ability to work long hours under pressure.

Q. What type of people will be on the course?

A. As mentioned, we have people from across the globe with varying backgrounds and this in itself is going to be a major point of interest on the course. In your planning stages you will use the attributes of different persons from different backgrounds to achieve your goals. Many of the friendships you make will be for life.

Q. What if I want to use this course so I can come to Australia and have a bit of a holiday, is that a problem. What if I want to shoot off one day for a bit of shopping.

A. Our advice is not to come because if this is your attitude then we don't want you on the course. Everyone will work hard and long hours but you will learn more about people and yourself in 6 days than you will in many years to come. This course will in some cases change the way you look at your life. The experiences you have will remain with you for life.

Q. I am travelling from overseas, what Visa will I need.

A. You will need a 456 Visa and this will need to be applied for at the earliest opportunity. Please visit or contact an Australian Embassy close to you. We can assist if need be. Details if this Visa are available at the following link
